**Post-thymectomy Membranous Nephropathy in a Patient with Myasthenia
Gravis: A Case Report**

Case Study : Myasthenia Gravis (MG) is a relatively uncommon disease with an estimated global prevalence of 12.4 per 100,000 population.¹ It is however, the most common neuromuscular disorder and has been reported to be associated with nephropathies.² The most often reported type of nephropathy in Myasthenia Gravis is Minimal Change Disease in contrary to Membranous Nephropathy (MN) which is seldom reported³. Here we report a rare case of Thymomatous Myasthenia Gravis with Membranous Nephropathy post-thymectomy.
